This session, we shall be working closely with Amy MacDonald, the Maths teacher at Tobermory High School. This will ensure that we have a shared understanding of assessment and moderation in maths across the Cluster.

We have been awarded £3000 for our Food for Thought bid. We have now got a double sink in the classroom upstairs (cost of £1000) and the bottom classroom painted which were both aspects of the bid. I shall be putting in an order for the remaining items very soon. This will provide us with the facility of undertaking once weekly sessions where the pupils help create a hot, nutritious meal which they can eat at lunchtime.

We received a fantastic cheque from The Grab Trust for £380 for our recent beach clean which is fantastic. This brings our grand total for 2015 to £549,33.

This term we are hoping to continue our Beach School on a Tuesday afternoon. As you are aware, a great deal of importance is placed on high quality outdoor learning and we want to ensure that we provide the pupils with an excellent outdoor learning programme.

The pupils will be starting to create a learning journal using the online facility of Skillsbook.
