## THE CHALLENGER BUS

On Thursday $13^{\text {th }}$ September the Challenger Bus will be visiting the island. The Challenger teams have been visiting schools since 2008 with over 150 primary and secondary schools visited around Scotland over the past 18 months. One of the key RME outcomes and experiences for early years is to become familiar with beliefs Christian people have about God and Jesus through Christian stories, images, music and poems. The older pupils will be exploring the lives and teachings of Jesus and other figures in Christianity, increasing knowledge and understanding of key Christian beliefs. Due to weight restrictions on the road, the bus cannot visit us at Ulva, so instead we will be visiting Lochdonhead for a joint school session with them there.
